Abstract Submission

Please consider the following guidelines for abstract submission

Abstract Writing:

A maximum of two abstracts are permitted per registration as a first author and/or presenter.

The abstract must be written in MS Word document (A4 size), Times New Roman, 12 font size, and 1.15 line spacing without inserting any special symbol, formula, diagram, table, or reference.

An outline of the abstract is as follows:

- a) Title (Max. 30 words)
- b) Author/s name/s
- c) Affiliation/s
- d) Email (corresponding author)
- e) Abstract body (Max. 300 words)
- f) Keywords (Max. 5 keywords)
- g) The body of the abstract should be justified

Save the abstract in MS Word following this format:
