In the light of Covid-19 pandemic and its devastating consequences, the JNU Vice-chancellor made an appeal on 19<sup>th</sup> May 2021 to seek support from the University's alumni to upgrade the health infrastructure and develop a well-equipped COVID Care Centre in the campus.

JNU alumni have always remained close to their alma mater. In less than a week since the appeal, they have donated around Rs.48000/- to the JNU Alumni Endowment Fund. Since the Administration had also appealed to them to donate oxygen concentrators, oximeters, masks, sanitizers and digital thermometers for the frontline workers, one of the alumni, Mr. Santosh Prasad, from the batch of 1995-2000 (Centre for Chinese and South East Asian Studies in the School of Language, Literature and Culture Studies), and currently the Head of the Rashmi Rare Earth Limited, an electronic manufacturing services (EMS) company based out in Noida, Uttar Pradesh, has generously contributed 5000 three-layer masks. JNU administration remains thankful to all its alumni for making their alma mater proud and helping JNU to achieve its objective to provide good healthcare to its residents.
